The Mayor and Council have adopted the National Sheriff's Association Neighborhood Watch Program with the liberty of the Point Pleasant Neighborhood Watch (PPNW) team to enhance and expand these concepts to meet the needs of Point Pleasant residents and our overall community. In partnership and with great enthusiasm we shall work with our Police Department and Governing Body to attain an effective and productive Neighborhood Watch Program with the following initial objectives:

- To ensure that each street within the Boro is represented in the program.
- Each district within the Boro will have a delegates to attend and participate in monthly public safety meetings to convey information and literature to all street captains, who will in turn disseminate the information to residents on their streets.
- To create effective and reliable sources of communication through a database of email, website and webcam formation, an actively monitored tip-line and security surveillance systems.
- To train residents in how to report crime, suspect identification, vehicle description and suspicious activities while applying the 4-D's of crime prevention. These 4-D crime prevention principals, if applied properly will reduce the law-abiding public from becoming a victim. The four principals include Deter, Delay, Deny and Detect.

Across the nation crime, vandalism and public safety is of one of the highest concerns to citizens and Point Pleasant is certainly no exception. Pt. Pleasant Boro residents, the Governing Body and Point Boro Police Department realize that they cannot eradicate crime working separately.
